A Microsoft upskilling program has been initiated for registered B.Tech. students. Soft skills and verbal training are provided to enhance oral and written communication. The Training Team conducts technical training on Python, Java, and C programming for pre-final students.

The NEP 2020 is a significant initiative aimed at enhancing the intent and content of the Indian education system. As an autonomous institution, the NBKR Institute of Science and Technology (NBKRIST) prepares its own academic calendar by adhering to the guidelines from UGC and parent-affiliated universities. The Academic Council of NBKRIST, composed of a group of senior professors from all the departments, prepares an institutional-level calendar for each academic year, and NBKRIST strictly adheres to the academic calendar of events, which includes induction programs for first-year students, semester commencement, examinations, and general holidays for all students. In addition, the academic calendar includes various academic activities like internships, internal assessments, and project work presentations.

This ensures compliance with the institute's academic calendar and promotes academic success. The academic calendar of events includes alumni meetings, NSS camps, and other events. Each department follows the academic calendar, highlighting department activities such as guest lectures, industrial tours, project exhibitions, seminars, workshops, FDP cultural programs, sports activities, and national importance days. The academic calendar lists NBKRIST information and department-wise activities. Continuous internal evaluation (CIE) involves slip tests, MID exams, and internal laboratory exams. Department Heads (HODs) analyze results to identify slow and fast learners. They create remedial or extra classes for slow learners to increase pass percentages.

For fast learners, HODs instruct faculty to develop experimental, participative, and problem-solving methodologies. This helps

improve the overall learning experience for all students.

NBKIRST has a comprehensive learning environment, equipped with various technology tools and resources. Classrooms are equipped with a blackboard, LCD projector, Wi-Fi, and iPads for interactive learning.

Laboratories have ICT facilities, a white board, and instructional areas. A dedicated seminar hall with multimedia capabilities is available for guest lectures, workshops, conferences, and seminars. The institution uses Microsoft Teams' platform to enhance learning environments during the pandemic.

Faculty and students are enrolled in their respective courses, and faculty upload pre- and post-videos as learning aids. During the pandemic, all the faculty members used all possible soft platforms, such as Google Meets, Microsoft Teams, PPTs uploaded through student e-mails, and live presentations through WhatsApp, and a self-developed database was maintained for assessments during the pandemic.

The Institute library subscribes to numerous e-journals in engineering, science, and technology. An in-house learning management system (LMS), i.e., NBKRIST INTRANET, was in place for content delivery, student tracking, and evaluations.

By adhering to the guidelines of JNTUA and respective regulations, NBKRIST regularly strives to revise the syllabus and evaluation scheme to meet global standards and keep students updated on technology trends. Being an autonomous college, NBKRIST introduces institute-made reforms to be implemented in the process of continuous internal evaluation (CIE).

NBKRIST strictly follows the evaluation guidelines, with internal tests and two MID exams conducted for each semester. These tests and MID exams are communicated to students and faculty through the institute academic calendar and discussed in IQAC meetings. The MID exam timetable is displayed on notice boards or online through WhatsApp groups.

The subject-handling faculty prepares multiple-choice questions for each unit, covering all topics. During the pandemic, internal

assessments were conducted using the college portal. Project reviews, seminars, and internships were conducted using Microsoft Teams' platform. Parents are informed about individual marks obtained by students, and parents receive SMS notifications for their respective marks.

NBKIRST adheres to the norms framed by the institute's internal academic council for the assessment of MID exams and semester-end exams, which are used for attainment calculation. Absentees are recorded in each department and analyzed for further action. Laboratory assessments, seminars, internships, and project reviews are held on Microsoft Teams using rubrics specified by coordinators.

If students are absent, additional review meetings are conducted, and necessary actions are taken to reduce the percentage of absentees. Department-level coordinators and the HOD address issues related to results analysis for internal MID exams; eventually, policy issues concerning students are discussed in the central internal test committee and resolved.

The management of NBKRIST provides independent residential quarters for teaching and non-teaching staff, with employee-provident fund and gratuity schemes. They offer a group insurance scheme, earned leave, and paid vacation. Staff members receive financial assistance for professional bodies, medical and maternity leave, and cash incentives for publishing research works. The campus clinic offers free primary medical services, and health camps are organized for both teaching and non-teaching staff.

In case of non-teaching staff, Annual Dearness Allowance revisions, financial assistance for economically backward staff children, medical and maternity leave, free primary medical services, health camps, and assistance to staff families in case of personal loss.

The college organizes campus health camps, supports students through various initiatives like the Computer Centre, Library, Book Bank, Canteen, Anti-Ragging Cell, In-campus Hostel, Internals Complaints Committee, and updated website. All teaching staff/non-teaching staff/students are provided with a subsidized transport facility from designated pick-up points to and from the college.

Laboratories have ICT facilities, a white board, and instructional areas. A dedicated seminar hall with multimedia capabilities is available for guest lectures, workshops, conferences, and seminars. The institution uses Microsoft Teams' platform to enhance learning environments during the pandemic.

Faculty and students are enrolled in their respective courses, and faculty upload pre- and post-videos as learning aids. During the pandemic, all the faculty members used all possible soft platforms, such as Google Meets, Microsoft Teams, PPTs uploaded through student e-mails, and live presentations through WhatsApp, and a self-developed database was maintained for assessments during the pandemic.

By adhering to the guidelines of JNTUA and respective regulations, NBKRIST regularly strives to revise the syllabus and evaluation scheme to meet global standards and keep students updated on technology trends. Being an autonomous college, NBKRIST introduces institute-made reforms to be implemented in the process of continuous internal evaluation (CIE).

NBKRIST strictly follows the evaluation guidelines, with internal tests and two MID exams conducted for each semester. These tests and MID exams are communicated to students and faculty through the institute academic calendar and discussed in IQAC meetings. The MID exam timetable is displayed on notice boards or online through WhatsApp groups.

The subject-handling faculty prepares multiple-choice questions for each unit, covering all topics. During the pandemic, internal assessments were conducted using the college portal. Project reviews, seminars, and internships were conducted using Microsoft Teams' platform. Parents are informed about individual marks obtained by students, and parents receive SMS notifications for their respective marks.

NBKIRST primary funding source is the annual fee received from students, which is collected in accordance with state fee regulations. The fee is converted into fixed deposits and withdrawn regularly to cover expenses. Eventually, NBKIRST generates income from student fees, grants from funding agencies, consultancy work, examination service charges, industry and government grants for incubation and entrepreneurship development, and separate fees for transport and hostel facilities.
